This year's 10th That Beats Banagher Festival is being held over two weekends. Details for this coming weekend can be found on the That Beats Banagher website under highlights where the events are outlined in 6 sections. On Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> July the return of the spectacular Fireworks Display in Banagher Park on the west side of Banagher Bridge at dusk, roughly between 9 and 10 p.m. All the events next weekend, 21st to 23rd July, will commemorate Charlotte Brontë and her husband Arthur Bell Nicholls and their connections with Banagher. These will include three films made in Banagher by Maebh O'Regan of N.C.A.D., Dublin. The first film, The Legacy of the Brontës in Banagher will be shown at 6.30 p.m. on Friday 21st and relates to an exhibition in Crank House which shows through a variety of textile panels several items connected with the Brontës and their association with Banagher. The work is a collaboration between the Banagher Crafting Group and Dr. O' Regan. The second film will be shown at 9.30 a.m. on Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> is called Arthur and Charlotte - A Victorian Romance was written by James Scully and performed by the Martello Players - Brendan Dolan, John Kennedy, Michael and Angela Flannery, Michelle Flannery, all from Banagher and Tullamore musician Val Hughes. The third film is on Sunday 23rd at 10 a.m. and is called The Discovery of the Brontë Family's Portrait in Hill House, Banagher in 1914 and stars Nicola Daly, Saoirse Flynn, Cora Stronge Smith and Brendan Dolan. All films will be shown in the Crank House. All are welcome, admission is free but donations are most welcome.
