CROS Naom Bhríde - St. Brígid's CROSS

St. Brigid 'Mary of the Gael'. Born in the mid-fifth century, and buried at Downpatrick beside St. Patrick and St. Colmcille. Brigid built the first Irish Convent beside a giant oak tree - this place became known as the Church of the Oak (Cill Dara) or Kildare as it is known today. The St Brigid's Cross is still made in Ireland today, and placed in homes on her feast day, February 1st, the day on which she died about 524 A.D. It is believed this emblem protects the home, and animals. from evil and want.
