with toil;

And for all this, nature is never spent;
Their lives the dearest freshness deep down
things;
And though the last lights off the black West
went
Oh, morning, at the brown brink eastward,
springs--
Because the Holy Ghost over the bent
World broods with warm breast and with ah!
bright wings.
